Watertight buoyancy compartments make the boat easy to right in the unlikely event of a capsize, and they also provide storage space for food and camping gear. On most models, floorboards keep your feet dry. Two can sleep comfortably on the wide, flat and dry floor of the boat under a tent sup-



ported by the boom. A small outboard motor can be fitted, and it's easy to lower the mast - even single-handed - to pass under bridges.
